#### What is the MAISRC?

This may be the answer to our prayers about invasive species on our lakes. In 2012 the Minnesota legislature appropriated funds to create an Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center at the University of Minnesota. They are now up and running and doing a lot of very interesting and productive research in reducing and preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species. Zebra mussels, milfoil, carp, spiny water fleas, are all coming our way and we need tools for our defense. These good folks are working on that. Meanwhile do what you can to prevent the spread to our lakes by draining, drying and clearing your boat between lakes.




## **Water Quality Testing**

## **Goodrich Ice Records**


Kathy and Dick Royce have kept ice in and ice out records since they came to Goodrich in 1995. The graph shows the number of days after January 1<sup>st</sup> to "ice out" on Goodrich, the days after January 1<sup>st</sup> to "ice in" and the number of days between "ice out" and "ice in".

In 1998 the lake froze over on November 20, but then the ice melted and it didn't refreeze until December 7.

Maybe it takes some more high powered scientific analysis but from the graph it seems the ice formation hasn't been greatly impacted by global warming....yet.

#### **GOLA Mission Statement**

The purpose of this organization shall be to promote the general welfare of the property owners and residents of Goodrich and O'Brien Lakeshore especially with respect to the natural resources associated with Goodrich and O'Brien.

#### Why should I join GOLA? What are the advantages for me?

- The primary job of the association is to protect our lakes. It's the lake that gives our property its value. It is GOLA's responsibility to monitor lake levels water clarity and water quality. These findings are reported to the Corps of Engineers three times a year. A nearby lake recently reported excessive nitrogen in their water. The Corps traced the problem to cattle farm up stream on a creek that flowed into their lake. Corrections were made and the lake is back to normal.
- We stock our lakes with walleye as they do not spawn naturally in either lake. If you catch one thank the association, the contributors to the Walter Israel Fish Fund, and the volunteers that have coordinated the stocking. That is the only way the walleys get here.
- GOLA works to educate our members through our meetings and correspondence on the importance of shore land policies and regulations that help to keep our beautiful lake clarity.
- We have been involved with beaver control as they can and do affect our lake levels.
- Our association works to make solid connections with other groups that can be of help in achieving our goals. Groups we connect with are the Whitefish Area Property Owners Association, the city of Crosslake, Fairfield Township, Crow Wing County, the Army Corps of Engineers, the state DNR, and the State of Minnesota. An individual can bring an issue to any of these groups, but a group representing 200 or more has a larger voice.
- GOLA encourages sociability among the good folks who live on and near the shores of the Bonnie Lakes. The association meeting is a good place to make new friends and chat with your neighbors. We all come to the lake to have a good time. Some fish, some boat, some like quiet, some like noise, some like to ski, some just sit by the water. We all get what we want, just not all the time.

While some are not always happy with things that happen on our lakes, or things done by the association we do a lot of good. GOLA is a democratically operated association, so come to the meetings and have your voice heard. See you on the lake. \$20 is a real bargain.
